How Softly Falls the Rain After several bouts of mean, battering rain during the past month, today's rain falls soft and sweet. As I write this Friday morning, it is also the birthday of Ted Koozer, one of our former Poet Laureates. To honor his birthday, the April 25th Writer's Almanac featured one of his poems. Here it is:

A Rainy Morning by Ted Koozer

A young woman in a wheelchair, Wearing a black nylon poncho spattered with rain, Is pushing herself through the morning. You have seen how pianists
Sometimes bend forward to strike the keys,
Then lift their hands, draw back to rest,
Then lean again to strike just as the chord fades.
Such is the way this woman
Strikes at the wheels, then lifts her long white fingers,
Letting them float, then bends again to strike
Just as the chair slows, as if into a silence.
So expertly she plays the chords
Of this difficult music she has mastered,
Her wet face beautiful in its concentration,
While the wind turns the pages of rain.

Sometimes gratitude and admiration come from just paying attention, and, along with the poet, we've had such bountiful opportunities to do that during our Easter season. At St. John's, we had no fewer than six services to choose among for Holy Week. Such a gift it was to know (even if we couldn't be physically present), Taize, Tenebrae, Healing, Maundy Thursday, and two Good Friday services were being said and sung, so we could mindfully follow Christ through his trials.

Then came the Big Joy of Easter Sunday with Reverends Jan and Bill both on the altar. Our choir and organ were alight with "He is Risen." With Dan at the helm, the choir broke into those sparkling, crisp *a cappella* songs, and I trust mine was not the only spirit that went soaring up into the rafters. (A fellow parishioner leaned over at one point in the service and whispered to me, "Our Jerilyn is a jewel." Indeed, a rare and priceless one.) That day too we learned that our Outreach Committee has been awarded a \$1500 grant to help alleviate hunger in our community. I daresay this is all part of Easter's expansiveness. Then, of course, we feasted together on lots of deviled eggs, hot cross buns, and the rest of it.

Easter tide spilled on into Easter Week when, a couple of days later, about 20 St. Johners journeyed to St. Andrews in Greencastle to join Sam Vaught for his Confirmation. A cantor sang, Bishop Cate blessed, and the organ's voice swelled the sanctuary. As we sang and looked upon all the new confirmands, our eyes also feasted on the colorful pots of tulips blooming on the altar. "Thanks be to God."

I suppose it goes without saying that we have been given this overflow of largesse entirely gratis; and, like the springtime rain, it is deeply restorative. Paying heed to such large stores of spiritual food stirs up our best selves, and we wish to give such wild hospitality back. May our joy and gratitude flower and overflow onward into summer.


