## January 2015

Many of us start the New Year with some "New Year's Resolutions." And, many of us don't do very well at keeping those resolutions for long. Why is it we human beings have such a difficult time changing our behavior, even when we know we should? Some experts say it takes at least 30 days for a habit to change. It's easy for 30 days to go by and not have changed our actions and therefore our habits are not changed. We shrug our shoulders and move on.

One habit we might want to consider changing as it benefits both us and our relationships with others is our lack of forgiveness. It's easy to stay mad at someone. It's less easy to forgive. And, we tend to conflate forgiveness and forgetting, which are two very different things.

Rob Voyle, an Episcopal priest who now spends most of his time teaching and coaching, suggests that one factor that makes forgiveness hard is that we don't know how to do it. Yes, I and others preach and exhort that we need to forgive- but we too often don't help people with **how** to forgive.<sup>1</sup>

If we don't know how to forgive, then it becomes easy to simply move on with our anger and bitterness too often festering and relationships foundering or ending. That's sad and it is something we can do differently if we will it to be different. Rob noted that after attending a conference on forgiveness where nothing was said about how to forgive that "the end result was that this noted pastoral theologian made us feel better about not being able to forgive rather than how to find freedom by forgiving."

To learn how to forgive, Rob suggests these steps:

- 1. Think about someone you resent. Resentment is at the heart of un-forgiveness. How does your body feel when you think of that person you resent? Maybe tight shoulders or jaw? What emotions do you feel when you think about the person you resent. Anger?
- 2. Now, think about someone you used to resent but no longer do. What happened to move you from resenting that person to not resenting them? What are you doing differently with respect to that person?


Rob believes that resentment occurs when we demand today that yesterday they would have acted differently. When we think of the person that we no longer resent, we have given up

demanding that yesterday's action be different. To forgive, we turn the demand for different action yesterday into a preference for different action in the future. He believes that turning a demand into a preference also allows us to maintain our values. Most often we resent someone because what they have done violated some value we hold. Our values are important and to say "it doesn't matter" is disingenuous and does not lead to forgiveness.

When we can identify the value that was violated, and find ways to protect those values going forward, we can reach a point to wish the person well. This is not about defining what "well" is. It is turning that person and the situation over to God, with trust and faith that God has the best interests of ourselves and the other in hand. Rob urges us to keep in mind that "forgiveness is independent of the person who hurt us. Forgiveness is purely about how I personally resolve what happened to me in the past."

Try it. See if this process helps you let loose of resentment, anger, frustration and disappointment. Remember that Jesus told us to forgive seven times seventy. We may never be best friends with the one who hurt us. We can, however, let go of what chains us to the past and look forward into the New Year with peace and grace. **Amen.**

Nominations from the floor, if any, will still be accepted according to normal rules of order. **Please** make sure that if you nominate someone from the floor that the nominee consents to being nominated before you nominate them **and** also that the nominee agrees to fulfill the requirements and expectations of being a Vestry member (see the November Newsletter for those requirements and expectations). If possible, please notify Rev. Jan in advance so she has a chance to discuss being a Vestry member with the person you plan to nominate from the floor. ## Reminder - Human needs assistance

- such as help

with rent, utilities and medical bills - is a growing need in our community. The Rector's Discretionary Funds are one way to help meet these needs. In 2013, we began delivering most of those funds, on a quarterly basis, to The HUB- an ecumenical ministry located at New Bethel Fellowship on Mill Street. They have trained personnel who help the person in need evaluate all of the various options for assistance, such as may be available through Salvation Army, the Red Cross, the Township Trustee, and a variety of other social service agencies and their own resources. Because The HUB has trained intake personnel, they are better able to evaluate true needs and to garner assistance from a wider number of resources. If you receive a request for assistance, please refer the person to The HUB, knowing that our funds are given to The HUB so that they can be used appropriately and wisely.
