Please take time to get to know them ahead of the meeting.



- Food finders- One time, preferably the summer distribution at Wingate but that is subject to Food Finders determination. Helen Hudson, Chair
- Donation to Mont. Co. Free Clinic to help with inoculations for children.
- FISH Monetary donation plus ingathering for wagons. We get a monthly list of needs. (Ongoing; Bud Arnold contact person for Board concerns)
- Nourish- a donation of money, people can volunteer individually by contacting Nourish. (Fall)
- REINdear- Tentative, depending on reorganization. (November)
- Summer Lunch- Three days with Tri Kappa Associates (July)
- Mardi Gras- Gathering on Shrove Tuesday with other churches. Chris Short, Chair. (February 9th)
- Animal Shelter Stroll for Strays (May)
- Meals on Wheels (Ongoing)

Other Outreach actions include:

- Groups using building (see Rev. Jan)
- YSB rental of Wheat House (annual rent of \$1.00)
- Habitat Lunches (if and when requested)

The evening begins at 5:30p with soup supper, continues about 6p with a brief prayer/worship time and then a discussion of Richard Foster's Celebration of Discipline. Our hope is that lay leaders will facilitate a discussion of various types of spiritual disciplines such as prayer, worship, service. Details will be available in the February newsletter.
