We are committed to God, to our church, and to each other as a family in Christ, providing and cherishing spiritual growth and living our faith in the community.



May 15, 2016 Pentecost: the day we celebrate the Holy Spirit descending upon the multitudes. A day when our differences of language were resolved and we could hear and understand each other. In the Episcopal Church, the liturgical color is red- the color for Feasts and special celebrations. We will light the Paschal Candle, symbolizing the presence of the risen Christ with the people of God. After today, we will put the Paschal Candle away except for use during funerals or baptisms when we are reminded that we die and we rise with Christ. ¹

Pentecost ("the fiftieth [day]") is the Greek name for *Shavuot* (Hebrew: lit."Weeks"), the Feast of Weeks. This Festival celebrates the giving of the Law to Moses at Sinai. The Festival of Weeks is when the first fruits of the harvest were presented to God. In Christianity, Pentecost is celebrated fifty days after Easter Sunday. It is often referred to as the birthday of the church.

With the change in liturgical seasons (from Easter to Ordinary Time), we will use green altar hangings for most of the time until The Last Sunday After Pentecost (also known as "Christ the King Sunday"). We will also change some of the aspects of our service. We will once again add the Confession (which we did not say during Easter season), we will return to the *Gloria* from


the *Pascha Nostrum*. From May 22nd through August 28th, we will sing the Creed (Wonder, Love & Praise 769) and we will no longer chant the Psalm or sing the doxology.

Ian Markham, Dean of Virginia Theological Seminary, reminds us that

the liturgy has been a vehicle of God's grace for countless lives.... The power of the liturgy resides in its capacity to converse with the complexity of our lives. The flow and movement provide space for worship, learning, confession, peace and finally, receiving the power of Christ through the sacrament into our lives.²

Leonel Mitchell, the dean of Episcopal Liturgy, wrote: We celebrate the time in which we actually live- the period between the Pentecost and the Second Advent.³ Green is thus an appropriate color. It symbolizes growth and life – and for those of us in central Indiana, wonderful green grass, picnics and outdoor activities. A time when we often reconnect with friends and family. Hopefully a time when the church is a meaningful place for us to be to celebrate the life given to us by Jesus Christ.

Parish Life: Char Lingen and Carole Meyer are looking to bring some life to the Parish Life committee, which fell dormant most of last year, and are eager to have some new members, or old members! We have been filling backpacks this school year, assisting with special needs children. Outreach continues each month through work we do in the community as well as projects we do as St. John's.

we may partake of Communion each Sunday and at other services. They make sure there is bread, gluten-free wafers, and wine for each service. Altar Guild members polish the silver and brass communion vessels and offering plates, launder and iron the communion linens and replenish the candles with liquid wax. Also, they launder the albs used by the Lay Eucharistic Ministers and acolytes. All of this is done so that we can enjoy the beauty of St. John's.
